RABIES TITER TESTING


SDVMA, in conjunction with the South Dakota Department of Health, will offer rabies titer testing from 10 am – 2 pm on Thursday, August 18th. Veterinarians and technicians can have blood drawn for testing with reports back to the tested individual.

This service will be provided on a cost recovery basis for \$47.50 per sample. Only checks will be accepted. You may bring samples for yourself or staff in a labeled container. (Name, DOB, address, phone number and date of blood draw).

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends veterinarians and staff working in rabies enzootic areas (which includes South Dakota) have a serum sample tested for rabies antibody every 2 years.

SPEAKERS

Margret Casal, Dr. med vet, PhD, Dipl ECAR

Dr. Casal earned her veterinary degree from the University of Zurich in Switzerland in 1984. She completed a Fellowship in Pathology in 1984-85, and received her Master's in Vaccinology/Pathology from the University of Bern in Switzerland in 1988. She was a lecturer in Small Animal Reproduction and Pediatrics and a resident in Medical Genetics, Pediatrics and Reproduction. In 1998 she earned her PhD in Pathology/



Gene therapy, and then did a Fellowship in hematology/stem cell biology. She is an Associate Professor of Medical Genetics, Reproduction, and Pediatrics at the School of Veterinary Medicine, University of Pennsylvania. Her clinical interests are pediatrics and genetic diseases, and research interests are gene therapy and genetic skin diseases.

Thomas J. Divers, DVM, ACVIM, ACVECC

Steffen Professor of Veterinary Medicine at Cornell University Dr. Thomas J. Divers earned his DVM from the University of Georgia and completed an internship in large animal medicine at the University of California at Davis. Dr. Divers returned to the University of Georgia for a residency in large animal internal medicine and ambulatory practice and later worked for 2 years as an assistant professor in the large animal medicine and ambulatory practice at the College. Dr. Divers then



moved to the University of Pennsylvania for 10 years where he was an associate professor of large animal medicine and served as chief of the section of medicine at the New Bolton Center of the University of Pennsylvania. Currently Dr. Divers is Professor of Medicine and co-Chief of the Section of Large Animal Medicine at Cornell University.

Dr. Divers has been the recipient of teaching awards at three universities, has received the Educator of the Year Award from both the AAEP and ACVECC and recently received the Cornell University Hospital for Animals Distinquished Service Award for service to referring veterinarians. He is a diplomate of both the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine and of the American College of Veterinary Emergency and Critical Care. Dr. Divers is currently consulting editor of Veterinary Clinics of North America- Equine Practice. Dr. Divers' current research focuses on newly - discovered hepatitis viruses in horses. Other research activities have included bacterial and toxic causes of liver failure in horses, equine neurological diseases including equine motor neuron disease and equine protozoal myelitis, equine lyme disease, equine leptospirosis, diseases of the urinary system and advances in internal medicine and critical care for horses, foals and dairy cattle.

SPEAKERS

Richard B. Ford, DVM, MS

Dr. Richard Ford is Emeritus Professor of Medicine in the College of Veterinary Medicine at North Carolina State University. He is Board Certified by the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine and is an honorary Diplomate in the American College of Veterinary Preventive Medicine.



Following graduation from The Ohio State University, Dr. Ford practiced small animal and equine medicine for three years. Subsequently, he completed an internal medicine residency at Michigan State University, then joined the faculty at Purdue University's School of Veterinary Medicine.

Dr. Ford is a Past President of the North American Veterinary Conference and continues his role as a member of the scientific program committee for that Conference. He is a co-author on both the AAHA Canine Vaccine Guidelines and the AAFP Feline Vaccine Guidelines. Outside of veterinary medicine, Dr. Ford spent 28 years with the US Air Force as a Biomedical Scientist. Dr. Ford retired from the USAF Reserve as a Brigadier General, where his last assignment was in the Office of the Air Force Surgeon General at the Pentagon.

Jeffery O. Hall, DVM, PhD, Diplomate ABVT

Dr. Jeffery Hall is a Full Professor at Utah State University, College of Agriculture, in the Animal, Dairy, and Veterinary Sciences Department. He also holds an appointment in the Utah Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory (UVDL), as the Head of Diagnostic Toxicology.

Dr. Hall has B.S. in Agriculture Economics – Farm and



Ranch Management and a Doctorate of Veterinary Medicine from Oklahoma State University. He completed an internship, residency, and a Ph.D. in investigational and forensic veterinary toxicology at the University of Illinois. He is a licensed Veterinarian and Board Certified in Veterinary Toxicology. His ongoing research interests include natural toxins and mineral toxicology/deficiency. He is actively involved with the research at the USDA Poisonous Plant Research Laboratory and the USU Antiviral Institute as a toxicologist, pharmacokineticist, and toxicokineticist. In his role at


the UVDL, for the past 19 years, he has analyzed thousands of forage, diet,

tissue, and bodily fluid samples, nationwide, for mineral content in order to delineate deficiencies and poisonings.

SPEAKERS

Matt D. Miesner, DVM, MS, DACVIM (LAIM)

Dr. Miesner is originally from rural New Mexico and received his DVM from Washington State University in 1999. Dr. Miesner began his career in private mixed animal practice in Pasco, WA; then completed a Residency, Master's, and ACVIM credentials at Ohio State University VTH, in Food Animal Medicine and Surgery.



Dr. Miesner has received awards for Recognition of clinical teaching excellence and hospital service at both Ohio State and Kansas State University.

David Twedt, DVM, DACVIM

Dr. David C. Twedt graduated from Iowa State University and entered an internship and medicine residency in gastroenterology at The Animal Medical Center in New York City. Dr. Twedt then joined the staff of the Animal Medical Center and was also a research associate at the Liver Research Center of Albert Einstein Medical School. Dr. Twedt is currently a Diplomate of the ACVIM, Professor in the Department of Clinical Sciences at Colorado State University in small animal internal medicine.



Dr. Twedt is past President of the ACVIM and Comparative Gastroenterology Society. Publication and research interests include liver disease, gastrointestinal disease and endoscopy. He has also been the recipient of several teaching and research awards. He is also the co-editor of the textbook Current Veterinary Therapy.

Amelia Woolums, DVM, MVSc, PhD, DACVIM, DACVM

Dr. Amelia Woolums is a 1988 graduate of the Purdue University School of Veterinary Medicine. She completed an internship in Agricultural Practices at the Kansas State University College of Veterinary Medicine in 1989, and a residency in Large Animal Internal Medicine at the Western College of Veterinary Medicine in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Canada in 1991. She later received her PhD from the University of California at Davis, where she studied aspects of the immune response to bovine respiratory syncytial virus (BRSV) infection in cattle.



SPEAKERS

Dr. Woolums is a diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine and the American College of Veterinary Microbiologists. Dr. Woolums is a faculty member in the Department of Pathobiology and Population Medicine at the College of Veterinary Medicine at Mississippi State University. In addition to clinical teaching and service duties, she undertakes research focused on the host response to infection in bovine respiratory disease (BRD), vaccination to prevent BRD, and immunity in cattle and calves.

Zachary Wright, DVM, DACVM (oncology)

Dr. Zack Wright received his DVM from Texas A&M University, College of Veterinary Medicine in 2004, and completed a one year rotating small animal internship in medicine and surgery at VCA West Los Angeles Animal Hospital in Los Angeles, California. He then completed a residency in small animal oncology at Texas A&M University, and became a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine-Oncology in 2008. Upon completion of his residency, Dr.



Wright joined the staff at VCA Veterinary Care in Albuquerque, New Mexico. In 2012 he joined VCA Animal Diagnostic Clinic in his home town of Dallas where he now serves as Director of Oncology. Dr. Wright has also served on the ACVIM Marketing and Communications Committee for the last 5 years and is currently in the second year of chairing the committee. He lectures across the country and has published scientific articles and book chapters. In his free time he enjoys spending time with his two boys, golfing and fly fishing.
