

RABIES TITER TESTING

SDVMA, in conjunction with the South Dakota Department of Health, will offer rabies titer testing from 10 am - 2 pm on Monday, August 13th in the Board Room of the Ramkota. Veterinarians and technicians can have blood drawn for testing with reports back to the tested individual.

This service will be provided on a cost recovery basis for \$80.00 per sample, which includes the blood draw. Payment must be by check written to SD Department of Health. You may bring samples for yourself or staff in a labeled container (label with: name, DOB, address, phone number and date of blood draw); the fee for testing samples without a blood draw is \$50.00.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends veterinarians and staff working in rabies enzootic areas (which includes South Dakota) have a serum sample tested for rabies antibody every 2 years.
