



Veterinary Technicians are invited to attend any large or small animal session to receive continuing education credit.

RABIES TITER TESTING

SDVMA, in conjunction with the South Dakota Department of Health, will offer rabies titer testing from 10 am – 2 pm on Monday, August 12th in the Board Room of the Ramkota. Veterinarians and technicians can have blood drawn for testing with reports back to the tested individual.

This service will be provided on a cost recovery basis for \$80.00 per sample, which includes the blood draw. Payment must be by check written to SD Department of Health. You may bring samples for yourself or staff in a labeled container (label with: name, DOB, address, phone number and date of blood draw); the fee for testing samples without a blood draw is \$50.00.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends veterinarians and staff working in rabies enzootic areas (which includes South Dakota) have a serum sample tested for rabies antibody every 2 years.

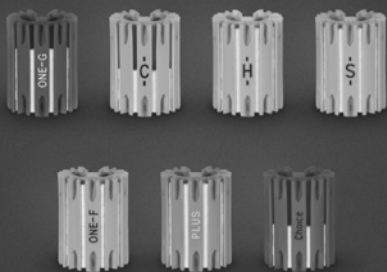

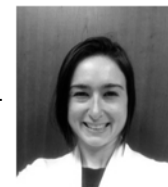
John A.E. Hubbell, DVM, MS, Diplomate, ACVAA

Dr. John Hubbell is the Chief of Anesthesiology at the Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington, KY, and holds the title Professor Emeritus of Veterinary Clinical Sciences at The College of Veterinary Medicine of The Ohio State University. Dr. Hubbell has been a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Anesthesia and Analgesia since 1982. Dr. Hubbell is author of numerous articles on veterinary anesthesia and coauthor of two textbooks: *Handbook of Veterinary Anesthesia* and *Equine Anesthesia Monitoring and Emergency Therapy*. Dr. Hubbell is an active member of the American Association of Equine Practitioners and speaks frequently at the annual meeting on topics related to anesthesia



Caroline Baldo, DVM, MS, PhD, DACVAA

Dr. Caroline Baldo received her veterinary degree in 2003 from the Sao Paula State University where she also completed a masters degree in veterinary anesthesiology in 2004. She provided anesthesia services to many private practices while also pursuing a PhD on vasoplegic syndrome and methylene blue at the University of Sao Paulo, School of Medicine. In 2008, she initiated anesthesia residency at Michigan State University and became a diplomate in 2012. In 2013 she became a clinical instructor at Louisiana State University and has been an assistant clinical professor in veterinary anesthesiology and pain medicine at the University of Minnesota since 2014.



Danelle Bickett-Weddle, DVM, MPH, PhD, DACVPM

Dr. Danelle Bickett-Weddle is a South Dakota native who now resides in Iowa, working as the Associate Director of the Center for Food Security and Public Health at Iowa State University. She is passionate about biosecurity, public health, and the cattle industry. She combines these topics in her work educating livestock producers, veterinarians, veterinary students, and the public about animal diseases and how to protect themselves and their livelihood. She has degrees from Iowa State (DVM and PhD) and the University of Iowa (MPH) where she teaches a public health emergency preparedness course. She is a Diplomate in the American College of Veterinary Preventive Medicine and is currently the president of the organization.



SPEAKERS

Ken Olson, PhD

Dr. Ken Olson was raised on a ranch/dryland farm near Scobey, Montana. He received his B.S. and M.S. degrees from Montana State University and completed his Ph.D. in Range Animal Nutrition at Utah State University in 1986. After graduating, he accepted a position at Kansas State University Agricultural Research Center-Hays where he conducted grazing livestock nutrition research. In 1992, he accepted a position on the faculty of the Department of Animal, Dairy, and Veterinary Sciences at Utah State University, where he taught undergraduate and graduate courses in ruminant nutrition and beef cattle management and continued to conduct research in grazing livestock nutrition and management. In 2006, he accepted a position as Extension Beef Specialist in the Animal Science Department at South Dakota State University. He is located at the West River Ag Center in Rapid City. His Extension programming is focused on the range-based cow-calf producers of western South Dakota.



Lynne Seibert, DVM, MS, PhD, DACVB

Dr. Lynn Seibert received her DVM degree from the University of Tennessee. After 3 years in private practice, she completed Master's and PhD degrees in neuroscience at the University of Georgia. She completed a residency in behavior medicine at the University of Georgia, achieving board-certification with the American College of Veterinary Behaviorists in 2001. She has presented over 2,000 hours of behavior education in 38 states, 3 countries, and 7 veterinary colleges. She owns a behavior referral practice near Atlanta. She shares her home with 3 dogs, 2 cats, 6 birds, and a miniature pig names Vivianne.



Joan Bowen, DVM

Dr. Joan Bowen graduated from Colorado State University College of Veterinary Medicine in 1976 and established Bowen Mobile Veterinary Practice in Larimer and Weld Counties in northern Colorado to provide on farm care for sheep and goats. This practice emphasizes improvement in management and nutrition to maximize livestock health and productivity while providing routine herd health procedures as well as emergency care. Dr. Bowen has served on the AASRP Board of directors from 2003 to the present and is currently the AASRP Delegate to the AVMA House of Delegates. In her spare time, she raises Saanen dairy goats, which has provided a steady learning curve over the past 49 years.

Dawn Boothe, DVM, PhD, DACVIM, ACVCP

Dr. Dawn Boothe joined the Veterinary Physiology and Pharmacology department at Texas A&M University in 1990. She became a Professor in 2003 when she joined the department of Anatomy, Physiology and Pharmacology and Clinical Sciences at Auburn University. She directs the Clinical Pharmacology laboratory which serves over 4000 practices. She teaches in 1st through 4th years and has mentored over 31 graduate students or residents. She has authored or coauthored more than 125 peer-reviewed scientific publications, 2 text books and over 60 book chapters. She has received the University Achievement award in Teaching (TAMU), Jack Mara Scientific Achievement Award for Scientific Achievement, College and University Graduate Student Mentor Awards and Zoetis Award for Excellence in Research.



John Richeson, PhD

Dr. John Richeson is currently an Associate Professor of Animal Science and faculty supervisor of the Research Feedlot at West Texas A&M University. He teaches several undergraduate and graduate courses, serves on numerous University and professional committees, and is an advisory board member of four different industry organizations. Dr. Richeson received his BS, MS, and PhD in Animal Science from Oklahoma State University (2000), Texas Tech University (2004), and University of Arkansas (2011), respectively. Research interests include evaluating management, nutritional, and immunological manipulations to improve health and growth of stocker and feedlot cattle. Additional research efforts have focused on evaluation of biomarker and behavior technology to assist in the prediction and early detection of bovine respiratory disease.



Jason Pieper, DVM, MS, DACVD

Dr. Pieper obtained his DVM from Iowa State University in 2009. From there he pursued his future in Dermatology with a rotating internship in the Greater Chicago area followed by a dermatology internship in Phoenix. He arrived at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign to start working on his MS in 2011 and started his Dermatology Residency in 2013. He became a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Dermatology in 2015 and has been a Clinical Assistant Professor since July 2015. His areas of specialty and research interest include ear diseases, allergic dermatitis, dermatophytosis, platelet rich plasma, dermoscopy, CO2 laser, clinical pharmacology, and dermohistopathology.
