SB 25	authorize the Board of Regents to enter into a lease-purchase agreement to acquire agricultural property in Moody County for the use and benefit of the South Dakota State University Agricultural Experiment Station	Allows the Board of Regents to enter into a lease for no more than 15 years and no more than \$120,000 to be used as an agricultural experiment station	Passed Senate Appropriations 33-0; Referred to House Appropriations	Support
SB 26	authorize the Board of Regents to demolish the veterinary isolation building on the campus of South Dakota State University and to make an appropriation therefor.	Provides the authority for the Board of Regents to demolished the dilapidated isolation building used by the ADRDL and provides \$70,000 for the demolish of the building	Passed Senate Appropriations 33-0; Referred to House Appropriations	Support
SB 59	establish the state debt collection office	Creates a state debt collection office to collect any debt owed to any state agency, the board of regents, the Unified Judicial System or by a constitutional office. Among the remedies available to secure the collection of the debt is the authority to nonrenew any professional license.	Referred to Senate Commerce & Energy: Scheduled for Hearing 2/17	Oppose
SB 61	place certain substances on the controlled substances schedule and to declare an emergency.	This is the annual update to the controlled substance schedule offered by the Department of Health. The update includes additional synthetic cannabinoids and Schedule II and III drugs	Passed Senate 34-0; Passed House 66-1: Awaiting Governor's Signature to become law	Monitor
SB 64	revise certain provisions regarding the registration of business names	Requires non-profit entities to register a fictitious name statement if the name of the non-profit does not clearly indicate the purpose of the entity. SB 75	revise the effective period of the travel permit for certain livestock used for rodeo purposes	Allows the travel permit for livestock used for rodeo to be valid for 12 months from the date of issue rather than only for the current calendar year (Amended to add an emergency clause)	Passed Senate 33-0; Passed House Ag & Natural Resources 12-0	Monitor
SB 142	enhance South Dakota.	A placeholder bill for any topic	Referred to Senate State Affairs; Scheduled for Hearing 2/18	Monitor
HB 1058	revise certain provisions regarding contagious disease control quarantine measures and to declare an emergency.	Clarifies the Department of Health's authority to quarantine a person who harbors an infectious agent (amended to name specific disease and remove emergency clause)	Passed House 41-27; Passed Senate Health & Human Services 5-1	Monitor
HB 1129	revise the property exempt from process in bankruptcy cases.	Provides an exemption in bankruptcy an interest in a vehicle not to exceed \$5,000 and increase the amount of personal property exempt in bankruptcy to \$7,000	Passed House 40-27; Referred to Senate Judiciary	Monitor
